Finance

- Thank you to those who support our church through your pledges and donations, and to the Ministry Teams/committees of NCC for being conscious of their spending.
- Finance monitors the financial health of NCC throughout the year.
- Hoyt, Gilippeti & Malaghan, LLC conducted an external audit and received the signed management letter in October.
- NCC received the Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) totaling \$36,855.88 and \$20,000 from the American Rescue Plan Act through the Town of East Lyme.

- Pledge income is \$19,496.67 more than budgeted, due to additional pledges received after Feb 1, 2022 and over payments (final pledge amount \$407,952)
- "All Other" is more than budgeted due to Children's Center Reimbursement

- Actual spend for Local Direct and Payroll are below budgeted because we had fewer staff costs and committees were careful in their spending.
- Administration is higher due to Technology upgrade and our decision to engage with a new support provider.

Cash available is equal to cash balance as of December 31, 2022 (\$372,793.02) minus Restricted Funds (\$196,297.94), and Uncleared check (~\$20,000) and one month of operating expenses (~\$42,000) is equal to \$114,495.08.

Thank you to all who have pledged! We cannot minister without you.



- We received 114 pledges for 2023. This includes 47 increased pledges and 8 new pledges.
- We strive to maintain a balance of \$35-40K minimum in the cash reserve for operating expenses.
- In the 2023 proposal, with \$42K for operating expenses, and accounting for restricted lines, which includes \$10,829 in Emergency Fund, we have a reserve of approximately \$114,000.
- We propose using the cash reserve to balance the budget deficit of \$34,268
- Property Maintenance has identified the need to replace the sanctuary roof in the near future, which will require a Capital Campaign. We also propose setting aside \$30,000 of the remaining reserve to start the Capital Fund for the roof replacement.







I move that we approve the proposed budget (including NCC Children's Center budget) for 2023, balanced with \$34,268 from surplus.







- It costs ~\$1,300 to operated NCC daily.
 - Utilities, personnel, contracts, office supplies, etc.

 This does not include costs for special events, contributions for coffee hour, outreach or most committee activities.





The Niantic Community Church, Inc., of Niantic, Connecticut, has established the cash salary for the Rev. Dr. Eric Elnes to be \$97,498 for the period from December 1, 2022 to November 30, 2023. In addition to the cash salary, the church will also provide a parsonage located at 20 Lake View Heights, and all utilities. Whereas Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 has provided that a minister of the Gospel may exclude from gross income the rental value of a home provided and any allowances used to provide a home: therefore be it resolved that the use of the parsonage located at 20 Lake Heights, plus all utilities and \$72,000 of the cash salary of \$97,498 provided to Pastor Elnes, to the extent that it is used to provide a home, be considered Clergy Housing Allowance Exclusion and be excluded from reportable compensations under Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.


